

## Other Immediate Concerns

 Active Current flood risk is spring runoff, increasing streamflows, and snowmelt. Some reported flood-related landslides are being monitored.

## Current State (SERT) Actions

- Update The DEM PIO continues to provide media engagement and media coordination with other staff to provide
  emergency public information as needed to the flood response efforts. These activities have occurred, and continue
  to occur, daily throughout the flood season. [ESF #15]
- Active Activated Emergency Support Functions: ESF #1, ESF #5, ESF #14, ESF #15, Logistics, VDCT, and Finance.

## **Current Operational Requests**

Update 9 active requests are in progress regarding State sandbag resources, management of State volunteers, additional SEOC staff, other flooding response resources, and information regarding the ability to assist with flooding from USACE. 1 active request for sandbags has been assigned, and 1 active request is pending additional information for flooding response. #### Salt Lake County

- New Residents are invited to come to the Salt Lake County Flood Control Shed to fill sandbags, either for the
  community to use or to take home on the afternoon of April 28th and the whole day of April 29th at the Salt Lake

- Active Due to current hillside conditions, Ann's Trail in Draper is closed to public use. [Draper City]

## Region 4

#### **Beaver County**

New Sandbags are being filled and citizens are picking them up that live in flood-prone areas. Clearing has been
done along Beaver Canyon waterways. A backhoe is also positioned at the diversion dam to remove debris from the
grates. [LNO Correspondence]

#### **Garfield County**

• New The higher elevation snow is starting to melt. Panguitch Lake is still frozen. The Sevier River is rising, reaching the top of its banks, and spreading into low-lying pasture lands. [LNO Correspondence]

#### **Iron County**

New Monitoring Cedar Canyon drainage, Coal Creek, Parowan Canyon drainage, and Patagonah Canyon drainage.
 No flooding issues at this time. Heavy equipment has been staged at possible choke points for debris. They are filling sandbags and making them available to the public. [LNO Correspondence]

#### Kane County

New They are monitoring the melt from the Duck Creek area. Kanab Creek is flowing higher but not out of its banks.
 Sandbags have been placed around the county for residents to use. No flooding at this time. Low water crossings are subject to closures at any time. [LNO Correspondence]

#### Washington County

New Monitoring Baker Dam and the melt from the Pine Valley Mountains that feed the Santa Clara River. Monitoring
the Virgin River and its flow out of Kane County and Zion National Park. No flooding at this time. [LNO Correspondence]

# Use caution around rising creeks, streams, rivers, and other waterways!

Water is expected to be running **very fast** and will be very cold. Hypothermia and drowning are possible with even brief periods of time in the water.

Give swollen waterways a wide berth and **monitor children and pets closely** as they can quickly drown in the cold, fast flows.

Slot canyons may be inundated with snowmelt runoff and become extremely hazardous.
